Reflection

Christians are indistinguishable from other men either by nationality, language or customs... With regard to dress, food and manner of life in general, they follow the customs of whatever city they happen to be living in, whether it is Greek or foreign. And yet there is something extraordinary about their lives... They live in poverty, but enrich many; they are totally destitute, but possess an abundance of everything.

Letter to Diognetus, late 2nd century AD

Call to Worship – Revelation 5

Liturgist: Then I saw in the right hand of him who was seated on the throne a scroll sealed with seven seals and a mighty angel proclaiming with a loud voice, "Who is worthy to open the scroll and break it seals?" No one in heaven or on earth or under the earth was able to open the scroll. The Lamb went and took the scroll from the hand of him who was seated on the throne. When he had taken the scroll, the four living creatures and the twenty-four elders fell down before the Lamb. And they sang a new song, saying,

Scripture Reading – Ephesians 2:11-14

¹¹ Therefore remember that at one time you Gentiles in the flesh, called "the uncircumcision" by what is called the circumcision, which is made in the flesh by hands—¹² remember that you were at that time separated from Christ, alienated from the commonwealth of Israel and strangers to the covenants of promise, having no hope and without God in the world.¹³ But now in Christ Jesus you who once were far off have been brought near by the blood of Christ. ¹⁴ For he himself is our peace, who has made us both one and has broken down in his flesh the dividing wall of hostility.

Confession of Sin

Liturgist: God of all nations, we praise you that in Christ the barriers that have separated humanity are torn down.

ALL: Yet we confess our slowness to open our hearts and minds to people of other lands, tongues, and races.

Liturgist: We have harbored sin in our hearts toward those who seem to be on the other side, the other team, the other party. We have not sought freedom for the oppressed, even though you have freed us. We have not bound up the broken even though you have healed us.

ALL: We have relied on our own achievements, pedigree, and behavior more than the justifying work of Christ for our sense of significance and security. We have not honored the image of God in our brothers and sisters who look different from us.

Liturgist: Merciful Father, forgive us our sins of prejudice and apathy toward the poor, the oppressed, and the brokenhearted.

ALL: By your Spirit, help us to remember that our sins have been fully paid for by Christ's death and that we have power to live differently because of his resurrection. Gracious Father, move us toward the day when all are truly one in Jesus Christ. Amen.

Congregational Prayer

Scripture Reading – Genesis 39:1-20

¹ Now Joseph had been brought down to Egypt, and Potiphar, an officer of Pharaoh, the captain of the guard, an Egyptian, had bought him from the Ishmaelites who had brought him down there. ² The LORD was with Joseph, and he became a successful man, and he was in the house of his Egyptian master. ³ His master saw that the LORD was with him and that the LORD caused all that he did to succeed in his hands. ⁴ So Joseph found favor in his sight and attended him, and he made him overseer of his house and put him in charge of all that he had. ⁵ From the time that he made him overseer in his house and over all that he had, the LORD blessed the Egyptian's house for Joseph's sake; the blessing of the LORD was on all that he had, in house and field. ⁶ So he left all that he had in Joseph's charge, and because of him he had no concern about anything but the food he ate.

Now Joseph was handsome in form and appearance. ⁷ And after a time his master's wife cast her eyes on Joseph and said, "Lie with me." ⁸ But he refused and said to his master's wife, "Behold, because of me my master has no concern about anything in the house, and he has put everything that he has in my charge. ⁹ He is not greater in this house than I am, nor has he kept back anything from me except you, because you are his wife. How then can I do this great wickedness and sin against God?" ¹⁰ And as she spoke to Joseph day after day, he would not listen to her, to lie beside her or to be with her.

¹¹ But one day, when he went into the house to do his work and none of the men of the house was there in the house, ¹² she caught him by his garment, saying, "Lie with me." But he left his garment in her hand and fled and got out of the house. ¹³ And as soon as she saw that he had left his garment in her hand and had fled out of the house, ¹⁴ she called to the men of her household and said to them, "See, he has brought among us a Hebrew to laugh at us. He came in to me to lie with me, and I cried out with a loud voice. ¹⁵ And as soon as he heard that I lifted up my voice and cried out, he left his garment beside me and fled and got out of the house." ¹⁶ Then she laid up his garment by her until his master came home, ¹⁷ and she told him the same story, saying, "The Hebrew servant, whom you have brought among us, came in to me to laugh at me. ¹⁸ But as soon as I lifted up my voice and cried, he left his garment beside me and fled out of the house."

¹⁹ As soon as his master heard the words that his wife spoke to him, "This is the way your servant treated me," his anger was kindled. ²⁰ And Joseph's master took him and put him into the prison, the place where the king's prisoners were confined, and he was there in prison.
